### Briefly describe the personal benefits gained from your project:

In hindsight, completing my Eagle Project challenged me to think and work in new ways that I never would have encountered in high school. First off, I learned that communication between all of the involved parties in the project is crucial. Unfortunately, as time would have it, the open window in which I needed to complete certain things for the project were mashed together with my AP testing and choir rehearsals for the biggest show of the year. I could not postpone my Eagle Project, so I had to figure out how I could get everything done. Whether my time management was exceptional or not in that situation, I believe that I would not have been able to come even close to the level at which I had managed things if it were not for all of my previous experiences in scouting.

### In your own words, describe what it means to you to attain the rank of Eagle Scout:

To be able to achieve scouting's highest rank for boy scouts is truly an honor that I will cherish. More than just another achievement under my belt, I believe the rank of Eagle Scout symbolizes the cumulative effort that I have put in, exemplifying my ability to stay focused and to work towards a goal amidst the many distractions of life. I admittedly have experienced my determination to stay on the path to Eagle waver more



than once on my journey. However, through my experiences, I have learned that it takes more than my individual effort to succeed. I have received enormous amounts of support from all types of amazing people, all of whom I owe my success to their support over the years. Thus, I believe strongly that not only does the attainment of Eagle Scout symbolize the efforts that I have put in but also the collective effort of all the supportive people that were involved in illustrating this success story.



### **Project Description and Benefit**

Briefly describe your project.

At Living Water Loving Mission in San Gabriel, the goal of this project is to restore the main all-purpose room so that it may be presentable and suitable for public use in the future for any and all types of events to be held. The room has been neglected for many years and shows signs of heavy deterioration. Safety hazards have manifested from the neglect such as protruding nails in an empty door-frame. Significant damages can also be found on multiple walls where the paint and drywall have sustained damage; additionally, wooden floor moulding has also been impacted where holes have formed, and filth has collected. Our goal for this main room is to completely redo the entire room. All walls will need to have their out of place mid-wall mouldings completely removed. Afterwards, the walls will be patched, smoothed, and evened out before gaining an entire new coat of beautiful Swiss Coffee white paint. Then, final touches to the room will be applied: imperfect ceiling tiles will be replaced, damaged sections of floor moulding will be replaced, protruding nails will be removed and doorframes (and doors) will be cleaned up and then painted as well.

Furthermore, outside of the room are multiple sidewalk plant beds where plants have been left growing without control or care. It will be our goal to trim the overgrown shrubbery and bushes, to remove all weeds, and to plant flowers to beautify the area, especially since these plant beds sit directly in the parking lot of the church, for all able-viewing eyes to gloss over. After removing dead plants, weeds, and unwanted shrubbery, we will also plant new, more appealing plants such as brightly-colored flowers and other shrubbery as desired by the beneficiary. Therefore, gardening will also be done in addition to the restoration of the room in order to attain a collective new look to the church.

In retrospect, the biggest aspect of the project will be painting the whole interior of the main room. The walls approximately cover a total surface area of 684.951 squared feet; this measurement has already taken into account all the doors that will be painted and all the windows that will not be painted.

The most difficult challenge in leading the volunteers to completing the project will be to coordinate all volunteers to work together when they are split into groups with separate tasks at different times. 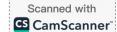

Council representative suggested I include a clear notion of the location of my project within the general description; in this case, I simply added the city in which the mission is located.

Project Description and Benefit—Changes From the Proposal

As projects are planned, changes are usually necessary. If they are major, it is important to confirm they are acceptable to the beneficiary. There is one wall outlet cover/wall plate that needs to be replaced, as it has been found to have its bottom two corners trimmed of which does not serve any purpose whatsoever. Therefore, to improve the aesthetics and reduce the occurrence of items getting caught on the cut corners, we will replace this. In addition, we will use a different color of paint for the doors; we will be using Ultra Pure White for the four doors that we are going to paint.

Will the changes make the project more, or less, helpful to the beneficiary? Explain:



How will you assure the tools used are in good condition, that clearance and barriers needed between users are considered, and that the tools are properly used and stored?

To ensure the safety of all volunteers, tools will be distributed based on each scout's capability to handle said tools. Adult supervisors will determine which scouts are capable of using which tools and will watch over scouts when they are using the tools. All tools to be used during the project will be inspected beforehand; faulty tools will not be used as they may endanger the safety of the user.

How long will your helpers be working each day? (Recommended no more than eight hours per day)

All volunteers will be working eight hours a day.

I will brief all volunteers of the tasks that they will be accomplishing at the start of my project. This in-person discussion will inform all volunteers about specific skills needed and the safety hazards that come with performing said tasks. Adult supervisors will also be instructed to remind all youth volunteers about potential hazards for their specific task.

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

### **Project Description**








As shown above, there is a missing section of floor moulding on the right side of the door. After the wall and door shown have been painted over with the new white paint, the wooden floor moulding will be installed here.



Shown is a section of the wooden door frame that has many protruding nails. These will need to be removed. It will then be painted over to protect the wooden door frame underneath from further erosion.



Shown is an overview look of the back wall of the room with the two windows that will be left untouched. Also shown is the continuing section of the wooden mid-wall moulding that needs to be removed; afterwards, the entire wall will be repainted white.

It can be seen here that overgrown weeds are prevalent; they will be removed, and new plants will be planted. Current shrubbery as seen that will be kept will need to be trimmed.










